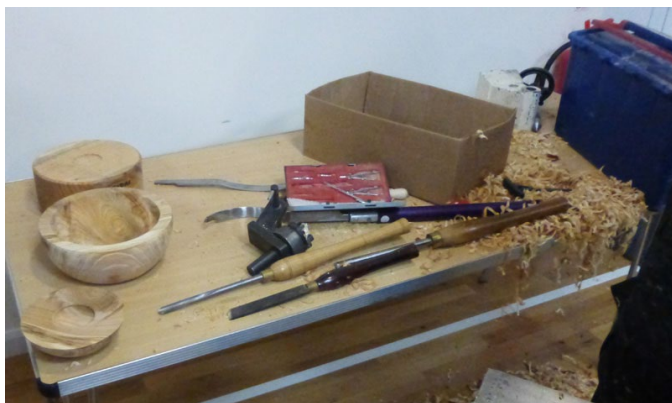
Meeting report
